You could give a woman the chance to learn to read



Like many women in Egypt, Soheer Azev (right) was forced by her parents to leave school early because less value was placed on educating girls.

Now with the help of Christian Aid partner the Coptic Orthodox Church Bless (COC Bless). Soheer attends literacy classes. Learning to read and write means that she can help her children with their school work. She knows that the literacy classes she takes are a real stepping stone to making her dream of becoming a police officer a reality.

Your gift of £44 could help another woman like Soheer to learn to read and write - skills that can help people to make a decent living.

At 19, Peter Akol Achuil (right) may seem an unlikely primary-school pupil. But like many who live in South Sudan, he has missed years of school due to the civil war. Even now with the peace agreement in place, life in South Sudan remains hard, and many schools are struggling to provide equipment for their students

Our partner the Hope Agency for Relief and Development has worked with Peter's school to provide better classroom equipment, and to build toilet facilities and a kitchen where nutritious meals can be made.



With a gift of £1,500, you could provide 25 two-seater desks for a class of 50 pupils – giving students like Peter the opportunity to learn and the chance of a brighter future.

Your gift could help to grow a garden of much-needed food



Cresencia Hernandez lives in Guatemala's highlands. In this region, around 70 per cent of indigenous children under five suffer from malnutrition. Cresencia's daughter was hospitalised when she was a child with acute malnutrition at a health clinic supported by Christian Aid partner Bethania. Recently, Cresencia's grandson was also hospitalised for the same reason.

Our partner Bethania has given Cresencia fruit trees and seeds to help her grow a thriving kitchen garden, using local resilient plants to provide essential nutrients to feed her family.

With a gift of £259, you could supply enough seeds and saplings for 10 kitchen gardens to give other people the chance to grow food for their families.

Give your gift – wherever the need

As you can see, Christian Aid stands shoulder to shoulder with communities around the world. Working together, we have the opportunity to end poverty once and for all.

If you choose to give to our work in general, your gift in memory could be used to support any of our lifechanging projects. With your help, children can get clean water to drink

Usani Wabela is a little boy with big ambitions, eager to learn and do well in life. Until recently, his health was poor and this affected his ability to learn.

Usani lives in Ethiopia where the most accessible water is from stagnant ponds and rivers. Drinking this water causes vomiting, diarrhoea and diseases such as cholera. But now our partner Water Action has helped the community to install a water pipe. Usani and his family can now collect clean water from near their home, and Usani is healthy and able to concentrate at school.



With a gift of £360 you could provide a water point for a community – protecting families from waterborne diseases and helping to keep children healthy.

Your gift could preserve a precious water supply



High up in the Bolivian Andes lies a small reservoir, which Guzman Alarcoa calls 'a miracle.' His community, La Granja, is one of many that depend on melting snow from the glaciers for the water supply for their crops.

As the glacier ice mass gets smaller, this valuable water source dwindles.

Christian Aid and partner Agua Sustenable have worked with Guzman's community to construct a reservoir, which collects rainwater and siphons off a small proportion of the water from the glacial stream. This reservoir means an extra day's water every week for the people of La Granja. You could help a community to buy all the materials and design expertise it needs for a reservoir – with a gift in memory of £3,715.

Your gift in memory could help train 1,040 community health workers and midwives, build maternity wards at health facilities, and start ambulance services for remote communities.

What makes this project particularly special is that for every £1 you give, the European Union will give £3, allowing the impact of your gift to be magnified.
