

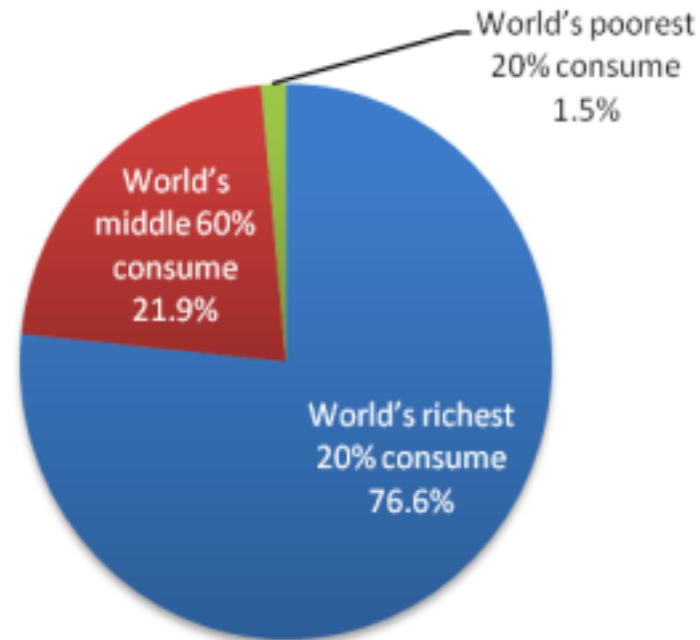

- Amount it would cost to provide clean water for everyone in the world: £6bn*
